## Re: Notice Of Hearing Of Objection To An Order, EJO Case Reference: C/22/01772.

Thank you for the letter dated October 10th 2022 from your office, which has been sent to me by Andrea Alexander.

Please know that as I still do not have any direct access to professional legal advice and representation of the kind which recognises and supports -- in practical and meaningful ways -- human rights law, constitutional law, international law, and tort law (which I understand the legal profession uses for dealing with "Duty of Care" violations), I feel I cannot sensibly attend the court hearing scheduled for Tuesday, October 25th 2022 at 10.30.

The problem for me of not being able to find proper professional legal advice and representation is not new to me. Evidence of this can be found in the text of a letter dated <a href="December 13th 2005">December 13th 2005</a>, written by Mr Gerard Madden (Senior Social Worker), to the then Northern Ireland Justice Minister David Hanson MP. Part of the text includes the following statement: "His efforts to secure proper legal representation have been thwarted at every turn". For evidence of the fact that this problem is ongoing for me, please see the references to "McCann and McCann Solicitors" (Belfast) at the top of Page 3 of the scanned copy of the registered letter dated October 3rd 2022 I sent to Mr G Adair at the following www location:

Although I do not claim to know for sure why I have been having such enormous problems with finding proper professional legal advice and representation (since around 1997/98), I do suspect that it may have something to do with the likelihood that members of the legal profession possibly do not wish to take on cases involving wrongdoing "at the hands of individuals and and public officials and bodies", which result in PTSD (POST TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER) and C-PTSD (COMPLEX-POST TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER) type injuries and symptoms for the "targets" who find themselves at the receiving end of such misconduct. Please know that provided the **Tuesday**, **October 25th 2022** hearing can be rescheduled until such time as proper professional legal advice and representation becomes available to me, that I am willing to attend the court hearing; and, that among the main issues I hope would be raised is the matter of why the presiding judge (whose identity is not known to me), and the The Northern Ireland Courts and Tribunals Service, appears to me to have decided, without any meaningful explanation to date that I know of, to completely ignore the request of mine for the adjournment of the court hearing scheduled for **May 18th 2021**, which I made via the registered letter I sent to Ms Heather Mulvenna on **May 10th 2021**. Attached please find a graphics image titled "The Right to an Effective Remedy" which, among other things, mentions "The right to legal and other assistance necessary to claim remedies". As far as I know, this "Right to an Effective Remedy" stems directly from Article 8 of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights which came into existence on December 10th 1948.

I have been feeling, for several years now, that I am being denied my "Right to an Effective Remedy" for no good reason that I know of.
